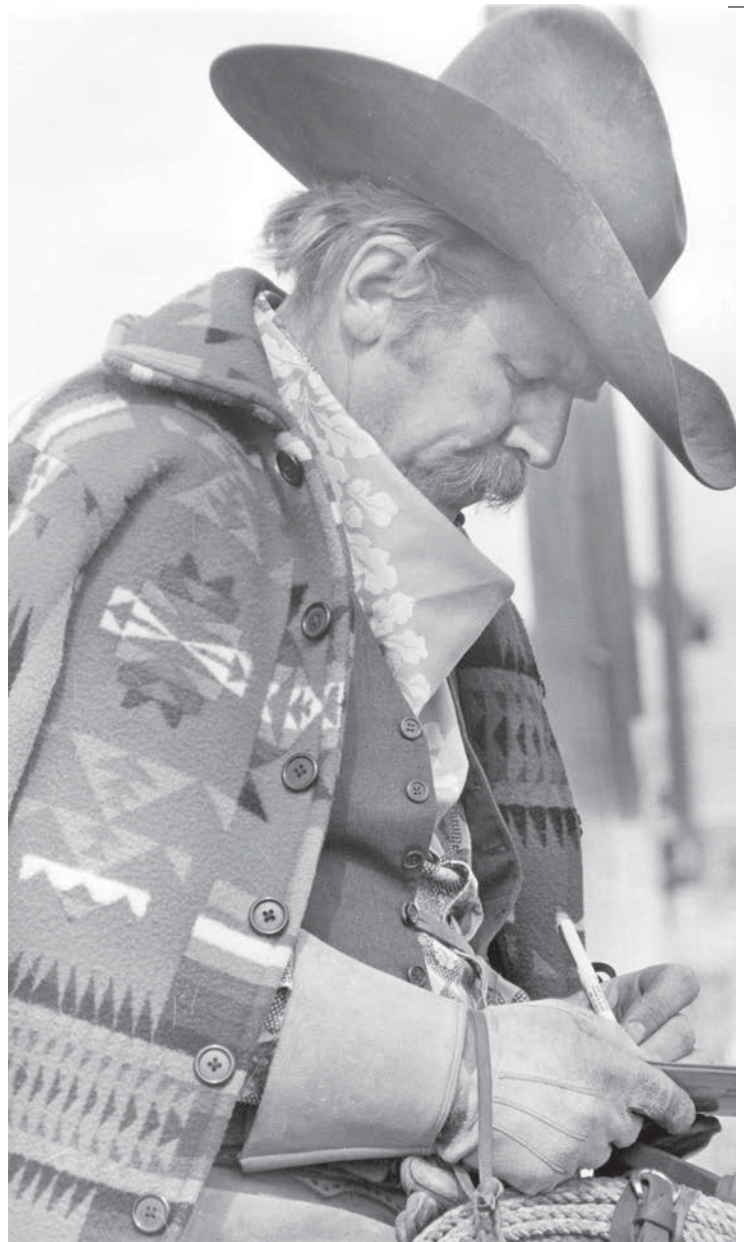

The Scottsdale Heritage Connection is community collaboration: a window to the past, a celebration of the present and a portal to the future.

This collection encompasses materials from Scottsdale's iconic history – photos, documents, oral interviews, books and more.

Why is the Library focusing on these materials? It is because they are invaluable and irreplaceable. The Library, as a community center, needs to preserve and share the wide ranging items with the community in a very visible way.



The **Scottsdale Heritage Connection** (SHC) will be prominently housed in a 2,000+ square foot space at the Civic Center Library. The professionally designed room will be branded with the SHC logo and photographic imagery from Scottsdale's history.

The collection of over 700 physical items currently resides in staff access only areas. The Scottsdale Heritage Connection will provide a physical space to use and enjoy these historical materials in addition to over 10,000 photos available in the digital collection.

Comfortable seating and meeting room space will be used for research, historical presentations and for viewing of images, videos and oral histories.

Highlights of the collection include:

- 390 Scottsdale related books
- Over 275 Scottsdale high school yearbooks
- 116 oral histories and more than 325 videos
- Scottsdale Tribune, Scottsdale Progress and the Arizonian newspapers on microform and/or in print
- City and business directories dated back to 1925
- Newspaper clippings sorted by subject and chronologically representing 50+ years of history
- Over 60,000 pages of digitized City of Scottsdale documents
